

Bus Services

Demand Responsive Transport (DRT)


From April 2021, MK Council is changing its subsidised bus services to a new innovative on demand service, known as Demand Responsive Transport (DRT).

With much of the fleet being electric, the new alternative will provide a more efficient and greener way to get across MK. Currently in MK including rural areas, there is no commercial bus service to take passengers from a safe pick up point to the required destination.

Passengers will be able to call or book on an app for a vehicle during services hours. We will be issuing more information once a contractor is chosen in early 2021.

In the meantime, the area previously covered by the service 28 is already offering DRT, the MK Connect, between now and April. This can be accessed via phone lines or on a smart phone app. Once you are set up it only takes a moment to book a journey. More information is currently available on the service 28 area here.

Junior Filmmakers has launched the first part of 'The Lewis Initiative' a filmmaking project which would see young people make films to discourage the use of knives with the objective of ultimately reducing knife crime in Milton Keynes.

The Lewis Initiative is named in memory of Lewis Wenman, a 17 year old who was killed in Milton Keynes in November 2020. Lewis lived in Oldbrook, went to primary school in Jubilee Wood in Fishermead and was unfortunately killed in Springfield all three wards within Campbell Park Parish.

His death drove home the urgent need to create communication and engagement programmes with young people to reduce the use of knives and save the lives of young people.

Following the deaths of Ben Gillham-Rice and Dom Ansah in late 2019, and Jay Fathers at the start of 2021 as well as Lewis, it's more important than ever that all organisations in MK place their hands on deck to do what they can to reduce any more loss of life due to knife crime.

Junior Filmmakers as a filmmaking organisation works with young people to teach them filmmaking skills and produce short films which can also have serious messages meant to encourage thought and change.

Funded by L&Q Foundation,

Junior Filmmakers will work with fifty young people from primary and secondary schools to produce five films with the theme 'Knives ruin Lives'. Once the films are completed they will be premiered to community leaders, schools and also toured to school assemblies.

The film screenings in school assemblies will be accompanied by talks from law enforcement, experts and people impacted by knife crime.

The project coordinator, Nana Oguntola explained that Junior Filmmakers already had funding to make films on knife crime in 2020, but these were cancelled due to COVID-19. She added 'I knew Lewis as a little boy when

he attended primary school with my son. They were friends and he spent some nights in my house. His death has brought home the gruesomeness of knife crime and has given an urgency to this project for us to work with young people to prevent any more young people dying due to the use of knives'.

The project is supported by Cllr Terry Baines, Cllr Paul Trendall and Cllr Ric Brackenbury.

Most importantly is the support of Lewis's mum, Lisa for the project. She stated that she wants to be involved in the project because she does not want Lewis forgotten.

Through 'The Lewis Initiative', Junior Filmmakers will work with partners to ensure the memory of Lewis Wenman is preserved in Milton Keynes. The first film camp of 'The Lewis Initiative' will take place during the February half term.

Planning Report 2020

Campbell Park Parish Council

To say the year for the Parish Council has been different in 2020 is an obvious understatement. The same can be said for the Planning Committee. We, as a Committee, have experienced a real mix of Planning applications in our Parish, a few that have been so contentious that many residents felt obliged to attend our monthly Planning meetings, especially when able to in person, before the lockdowns meant online meetings only.



During the year we considered and responded to 103 planning applications, of which 11 were refused by Milton Keynes Council, with 2 appeals still outstanding. We also considered and responded to 20 licensing applications, which were mainly for renewal of mobile fast food outlets on various estates in the Parish.

As a Planning Committee our purpose is to look after the applications for all of our residents, which means assisting with advice to pass home improvements through as well as understanding and objecting to an application that may be perceived to be unfair and harmful. Many of our Committee Members have been part of Planning for several years, and I know, in my case, it is the Committee I am most passionate about.

Planning Permission

Within our Parish, one of the main areas of concern is the number of properties that have undertaken a



change of use without planning permission; for those residents not aware of the regulations, any house in multiple occupation needs to be licensed in addition to requiring planning permission. A sub-committee has been set up to address the issue and we do appreciate any help from residents that can alert us to sudden changes or conversions.

New Developments

During the year we have been advised of the opportunity of new

developments being planned within our Parish, particularly for greatly needed Social Housing, and we will update residents when we can in Homeground.

As Chair of Planning, an honour I value highly, I am always available by e-mail to assist with any planning issues within our Parish, together with transport or Infrastructure issues which are also part of this Committee's remit.

The Trustees had their Annual AGM by video link on the 10th October 2020.

The Re-election of the chairperson was Christa Pumfrey the vicar of Ravenstone, the Membership of the committee was approved with a new trustee to replace John Muncaster with John Howard of Woolstone and the Minutes of the meeting of the 5th October 2019 were agreed. All other Trustee's remain the same. Also agreed to provide copies of the updated maps to all trustees showing the boundary of Milton Keynes.

The committee approved the Clause 16 amounts of £125 payments which are for Sunday schools in Ravenstone and Stoke Goldington and £500 for Woolstone. The committee had a report from the Village Hall Management of Ravenstone which the Charity owns and supports for repairs and updating the fabric of the Hall.

Grant applications to the Charity for this year were 22 and spread across the Villages from Ravenstone, Stoke Goldington, Weston Underwood, Gayhurst, Monkston, Broughton, Woolstone, some parts of Fishermead, Willen & Campbell Park.

The Funding of the Grants comes from the investments made by the Charity.

The total amount spent for this year was £8,800. The grant size to the applications were made smaller due to the number of applicants and with a maximum of £500 1st applications and £250 for 2nd applications starting as from 2021.

The committee approved the accounts and to reappoint the auditors and acknowledge the Charity Commission returns 2019.

The committee noted the letters of thanks received from previous applications for grants for 2019. The next meeting is at Ravenstone village hall on the 2nd October 2021.

Reducing our Rat Population

Residents will have noticed the explosion in rat numbers across the Parish. This has come about because over the past 10 months many of us have spent a lot more time at home due to the Covid Pandemic where we have generated a significantly higher amount of food waste.

Most of this food waste has found its way into black bags and in some instances in recycling bags. Add to the mix the minority of homes dumping their rubbish bags across the public green spaces, car parks and alley ways and this food waste becomes a really tasty Rat banquet. The rat population then increases and your Parish Council then receives even more complaints about the furry little rodents.

So what can be done to eliminate this rat epidemic?

The answer is actually quite simple. We educate all residents to use a green bin to put their food waste into. It sounds simple but of course we all know that its not that easy.

Solution

Well it can be that easy, Milton Keynes Council will be happy to give every household a green bin and the booklets to help you all recycle responsibly. If we all had green bins and used them properly we would cut the supply of food for the rats and they would have no need to stay where they are.

It is no surprise to me or the Parish Council that we do not get complaints about rats from estates that have a higher percentage usage of green bins so we know this works.

That's not the end of what we need to be doing. You will have seen a large number of black Rat bait boxes around the worst affected area of the Parish. This is part of a £100,000 project by Milton Keynes Council to help with the problem. We are also keeping a very close watch on the retail and takeaway food outlets in the Parish.

Some have already had visits with regards to the control of waste and their responsibilities.

Campbell Park Parish Council are taking this issue very seriously

but it will take all households and Landlords of our many Homes in Multiple Occupation to take their responsibilities seriously and that means no more food waste in bags, no more fly tipping of waste across the area and ensuring rubbish bags only get put out on the correct day.

Please help us to make your area a safe, clean and more pleasant place to live.

What goes in the green wheelie bin?

You can put food and garden waste into your green wheelie bin. Each week, leave the bin out on your property boundary for collection.

The bins are collected by specially adapted bin lorries that can lift wheelie bins into the back of the lorry which is why the bin should not be too full and the lid is closed.

The food and garden waste is processed and eventually becomes compost for agricultural land in England.

Top tip for a clean bin!

Use a kitchen caddy to collect your food waste. Line the caddy with newspaper or a compostable caddy liner then when it's full just tie it up and pop it in the green wheelie bin.

You can get a free grey kitchen caddy from us using the order form on our website



Remember to check for the Seedling logo when buying caddy liners to check they are compostable.
