ANNUAL MEETING OF ELECTORS

The recent Annual Meeting of Electors was a memorable occasion, marking the first time attendees gathered in the new Community Hub. There was a sense of anticipation as residents explored the space and prepared to engage with the meeting's theme: 'local heritage.'

Guest speaker Tim Skelton delivered an insightful and engaging presentation on the history of estates within the CPCC area. Tim has lived in Milton Keynes since 1979 and spent ten years working for the Development Corporation, focusing on land sales for housing and commercial development. He now chairs Milton Keynes Forum and regularly leads Heritage Open Day walks, sharing his knowledge of the city's past.

Attendance was strong, with many residents participating in a lively Q&A session. Councillors from CPCC responded to a range of queries, fostering an atmosphere of engagement and community within the Hub. The event concluded with a sense of enthusiasm for future gatherings.



LANDSCAPING UPDATE

Looking After Our Green Spaces

As we move from winter into the busier summer season, we wanted to share an update on the work of the landscaping team and some of the improvements you may have seen across your local area.

Our winter programme has now come to an end. This is the time of year when we carry out our heavier works, including large-scale shrub reductions and tractor flail operations. These are important in keeping planting areas healthy, manageable, and safe. While this phase is now complete, lighter shrub management will continue throughout the summer months where needed, helping us to keep footpaths open and maintain clear sightlines across our parks, alleyways, and redways.

This year, our main mowing programme started slightly later than usual due to the persistently heavy rainfall and saturated ground conditions. However, our teams are already working hard to catch up and bring the schedule back on track. The delayed start has also given us the opportunity to bring forward some additional works in collaboration with Milton Keynes City Council (MKCC).



One of these projects included crown lifting the London Plane trees in Springfield, along Kenwood Gate and the Boulevard, out towards the V8. This work involved removing the lower branches to create the necessary clearance for a double-decker bus, which has now been introduced on this route. This is a welcome improvement for residents, particularly during peak travel times, as it reduces the need for multiple buses and supports a more efficient and environmentally friendly service.

We have also been working closely with the MKCC Transformation Team. This team focuses on areas where planting has reached the end of its natural life or has become overrun with weeds and invasive species. These spaces are carefully assessed and either replanted with more suitable shrubs or returned to grass, with planting relocated to more appropriate locations. This ensures that while some areas are simplified, the overall green space is maintained and improved.

This year, transformation works have already taken place in parts of Fishermead and Willen.

In Fishermead, we supported a request from the police to improve a courtyard that had been linked to increased reports of anti-social behaviour. The team carried out a full clearance of the woodland understory, opening up the space and significantly improving visibility. This removes hidden areas and creates clearer sightlines for both residents and patrol vehicles. Feedback from the local community following these works has been very positive.

Further improvements in Fishermead include the preparation of another courtyard that had outgrown its original planting scheme. The area has now been cleared and is ready to be reinstated as grass, which will greatly improve both its appearance and usability for residents.

In Willen, we completed preparatory work at the play park behind Willen Hospice. Over time, the surrounding shrub beds had become heavily overgrown with bramble and self-seeded vegetation, blocking footpaths and

making the space feel less welcoming. We also removed several old tree stumps around the parking bays. These works have made a noticeable difference, creating a more open, accessible, and pleasant environment for visitors and families.

As we are now well into the main growing season, our teams will continue to focus on managing overgrowth, particularly in areas where it affects visibility and access. While we aim to cover as much as possible through our scheduled works, we always welcome feedback from residents.

Springfield Forest Garden taking shape

Following our report to you in the last edition of Homeground, we are pleased to see the exciting developments taking place to create the Springfield forest garden. MKCC have been busy preparing the ground and installing fencing ready for the planting to take place.

The planting will consist of some new tree and shrub saplings (native varieties, including several fruiting varieties) and a small community allotment site, with raised beds and fruit trees.

We've already been contacted by a number of local residents from across the CPCC area keen to volunteer to help us maintain it and enjoy the produce as it is available. Thank you!

If you would like to join the volunteer team, please get in contact. Experience doesn't matter, so whether you're a green fingered

expert, or just fancy spending some time outside with your hands in the soil, and you want to have a go at growing fruit, vegetables, herbs or cut flowers, get in touch!

All ages are welcome, and we'll be looking to arrange one or two mornings a week, throughout the year. We'd like it to be a relaxed environment for people to come together, reap the mental health benefits of spending time outside with like-minded people, surrounded by nature, and literally enjoy the fruits of their labour.

The Willows and Early Years Centre Summer News

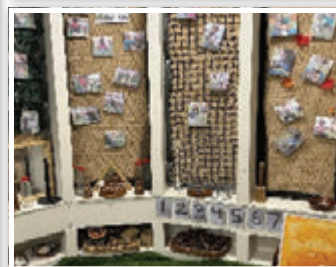
Our school is a busy place always and this term has been no exception. We have celebrated World book day in our pyjamas, sharing stories and bringing our favourite books to school.

Willen Primary School Exciting Learning

It has been another busy and inspiring term at Willen Primary School, with children across the school enjoying a range of exciting enrichment opportunities that bring learning to life.

In Early Years, the children were thrilled to welcome **Safari Stu**, who brought a fascinating collection of animals for them to meet. The children loved learning about different creatures and exploring their unique features up close, sparking lots of curiosity and excitement.

Year 1 pupils went on a **Spring Walk** as part of their Science learning, observing seasonal changes in the local environment. They spotted signs of spring and discussed how nature changes throughout the year.

Year 2 children also explored the local area during a **Geography Fieldwork Walk**, where they identified key landmarks and features in the community,

helping them develop a better understanding of the place where they live.

In Year 3 and 4, learning came alive when pupils **created exploding volcanoes** linked to their learning about Pompeii, helping them understand how volcanoes work and why the eruption had such a devastating impact.

Year 5 travelled back in time during a **Viking Day**, where they experienced aspects of Viking life and deepened their historical understanding.

Year 6 explored creativity through **Street Art**, learning about the cultural influences and purposes of graffiti.

Visit to MK Safety Centre for all Year 5's: CPCC-funded trips making a real difference



CPCC were pleased to be able to offer the Year 5 students and Orchard Academy, Willen Primary and Jubilee Wood School the opportunity to visit the MK Safety Centre again this year.

The visits, which CPCC have funded since 2019, allows every child in Year 5 attending a school in our area to visit MK Safety Centre (Hazard Alley). The experience takes the children through a series of hands-on, real-world scenarios. With support from the centre's fantastic volunteers, pupils are guided step by step and encouraged to think carefully about what "staying safe" really looks like in everyday situations.

Feedback from the schools have reported back to us that the learning came thick and fast. Children practised how to make an effective 999 call—including exactly what information to share in an emergency. They also explored online safety, spotting potential risks and talking through smart ways to stay safe while using the internet. And because safety isn't just about screens, water safety featured too, helping

pupils think sensibly about how to respond around different water environments.

Headteacher at Jubilee Wood said "The children benefited greatly from this experience, not only developing practical safety skills but also learning the importance of making responsible choices. Their enthusiasm and engagement were evident throughout the day. It was a valuable and memorable visit that will have a lasting impact on their understanding of personal safety."

Alongside practical skills, the sessions reinforced the importance of making responsible choices—and the children's enthusiasm showed all day. It's the kind of experience that sticks, giving Year 5s knowledge and confidence they can carry with them well beyond the school gates."

Staff described the day as both exciting and genuinely valuable, and they were especially proud of how the children carried themselves. From start to finish, pupils represented the school brilliantly, showing excellent behaviour and making the most of the opportunity.



Following the popularity of the sessions held in December and February & resident requests for more sessions, we are pleased to confirm that more opportunities for CPCC residents to take part in Sound Healing sessions at the CPCC Community Hub will be coming very soon. So that we can offer these sessions on a regular basis, participants will be asked to contribute £10 per person (paid in advance to secure a space), with spaces offered on a first come first served basis. The number of spaces will be limited, with CPCC residents given priority

CPCC residents are invited to step away from the rush of everyday life and reconnect with themselves and others at a special wellbeing event by the water organised by Yoga State of Mind and supported by Yoga for Health Alliance (Milton Keynes) and Campbell Park Community Council. Set against the peaceful backdrop of Willen Lake North, on the grounds of The Maze, right by The Peace Pagoda, the gathering offers a welcoming space for people of all ages and abilities to slow down, breathe, and simply be. It is a unique opportunity for reflection, connection as well as gaining new understanding through educational activities and plentiful sessions.

At its heart, the event is about community. Whether you're completely new to yoga, returning after a break, or already have an established practice, everyone is encouraged to join—no flexibility, experience, or expectations required. The focus is not on performance, but on participation, connection, and feeling a little better in yourself.

Throughout the day, a variety of yoga and wellbeing sessions will be led by local practitioners who are passionate about making these practices accessible to all. In a spirit of inclusivity, sessions are free for those who need it, otherwise participants are asked to make a donation to contribute towards the event's costs, helping to sustain this grassroots initiative.

More than just a series of classes, the day is a gentle reminder of the importance of mental wellbeing. For many people—particularly those navigating illness, stress, or difficult times—finding ways to reconnect can feel overwhelming. This event aims to open that door in a simple and supportive way, encouraging small but meaningful moments: moving the body, sitting in nature, and sharing space with others.

A unique aspect of the event is its foundation in Karma Yoga, with local teachers generously offering their time and expertise for the benefit of the community. This spirit of kindness and generosity has helped the gathering grow year after year into something truly special—a place where people can feel supported, included, and less alone.

Held in recognition of International Yoga Day, which was established by the United Nations to celebrate the holistic benefits of yoga, the event reflects a global movement toward greater health and harmony.

The event is funded through participant donations and sponsorship, including support from returning sponsors: Urban Om Yoga, an infrared hot yoga studio based in Buckingham, and The Poplar Osteopathy Clinic, which combines healthcare with massage and yoga, based in Bletchley.

Attendees are encouraged to bring a yoga mat, some water, and perhaps a friend—but coming alone is just as welcome. In this shared space of calm and connection, you're sure to find good company.

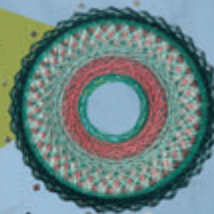
