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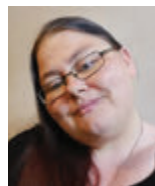

LANDSCAPING UPDATE

Campbell Park Community Council

From the CPCC Landscaping Team

Summer is the busiest time of year for the landscaping team. With grass, shrubs and weeds all growing at full speed, our days are spent balancing routine maintenance with responding to reports from residents and dealing with safety-critical work across the parish.

We know that when you report an issue, you naturally want to know what happens next. How do we decide which jobs to do first? Why are some areas attended to straight away while others take a little longer? This month, we'd like to give you a behind-the-scenes look at how we prioritise our work and why some landscaping tasks take precedence over others.

What Happens After You Report a Landscaping Issue?

One of the questions we're often asked is, "What happens after I've reported a landscaping issue?"

Every request sent to the landscaping team is reviewed and assessed. Wherever possible, we aim to respond within five working days, although this can vary slightly during the busiest parts of the growing season.

The first thing we look at is whether the issue presents a safety concern. Overgrown vegetation affecting visibility at road junctions, footpaths, crossings or access points is treated as a priority and scheduled as quickly as possible. Public safety will always come before cosmetic maintenance, which means our team sometimes has to make difficult decisions about where our time is best spent.

You may occasionally notice shrubs or hedges being cut back quite heavily during the summer months. Wherever possible, we avoid carrying out major pruning during the bird nesting season. However, when vegetation begins to obstruct visibility or create a genuine safety risk, we may need to intervene. Before any work is carried out, the area is always checked for active bird nests, and work only proceeds where it is safe and lawful to do so. So, if you see more

substantial cutting taking place during the summer, it's almost always because there is an important safety reason behind it.

If a reported issue isn't safety related, we then look at whether it can be incorporated into our routine maintenance programme. Many jobs are already due to be completed as part of planned works, and where possible we'll deal with them during those visits rather than making a separate journey. This helps us make the best use of our small team's time and keeps the service running as efficiently as possible.

Not every landscaped area is maintained at the same frequency. Our aim is for the main ornamental areas to receive a significant cut back at least once each year. Other shrub beds may only require attention every two years, while some are managed on a longer rotation using a technique called coppicing. Although this can look quite dramatic at first, it encourages healthy new growth and helps keep plants thriving for years to come.

Many residents have also noticed that grass and vegetation seem to be growing for much longer than they used to. We've certainly seen this too. The traditional lull in growth towards the end of summer is becoming less common, meaning our team has much less opportunity to catch up between mowing cycles. While we're always working to stay ahead, the longer growing season means we have to carefully balance routine maintenance with reactive work and safety-critical tasks throughout the summer.

Finally, if you spot something that needs our attention, the best way to let us know is by emailing [**landscape@campbell-park.gov.uk**](mailto:landscape@campbell-park.gov.uk). Sending all landscaping requests to one dedicated inbox helps us log, prioritise and schedule work more efficiently, ensuring nothing gets missed.

BEE ORCHIDS

At the end of May we were excited to find some flowering Bee Orchids amongst some grass verges in Oldbrook. We avoided mowing these areas in June to protect them.

These beautiful orchids are less common than they used to be, due to factors including climate change, habitat loss and the reduction in the population of pollinators.

The bee orchid is a native orchid in Britain. Conservation efforts are crucial to help these beautiful orchids and their habitats thrive in the face of these challenges.

The Bee orchid is the county flower of Bedfordshire.

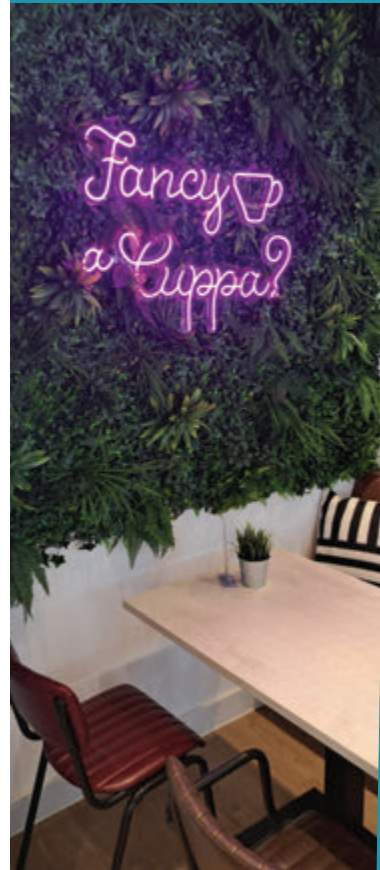

Yoga4Health

The Yoga4Health evidence-based programme was **commissioned by the NHS and created by the Yoga in Healthcare Alliance**. It fuses the wisdom of ancient practices with modern medical science.

The programme's benefits have been validated by Westminster University. Yoga4Health classes are inclusive and secular and do not promote any religious position.

**10 week programme starts on 15 September 2025
at CPCC Community Hub, Springfield Blvd. MK6 3JS**

Who is the yoga programme suitable for?

- those with stress, anxiety or mild to moderate depression
- those at risk of type 2 diabetes or cardiovascular disease
- residents suffering with social isolation

What will the Yoga4Health Classes involve?

Each of the 10 sessions will be led by an expert Yoga4Health teacher and will include:

- * Breathing practices
- * Simple yoga postures
- * Meditation and mindfulness
- * Relaxation
- * Group discussion

No prior experience is needed and the gentle stretching and strengthening yoga postures can be done in a chair or on a yoga mat.

There are limited places available to take part in this programme, which has been **fully funded by Campbell Park Community Council**. As we expect this to be popular, if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity, please register your interest by following the links below.

If you are invited to join the programme, a cash deposit of £25 will be required to secure your place. Whilst this programme is open to everyone, priority will be given to residents of CPCC area.

On completion of the 10 week course, if you have maintained an attendance level of at least 80%, your deposit will be returned to you in full. If after attending the first session, the course isn't for you, it will be possible to withdraw from the course and your deposit will be returned to you and someone on the waiting list will be allocated the space for the remaining 9 weeks.

WHAT'S NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH, you might ask..

It's about being ears and eyes to support the Police for a safer and stronger community: for ourselves, our family and our neighbourhood. Here's how:



- A visible Watch is a deterrent to crime and anti-social behaviour. **The Police tell us crime is 20% lower in Neighbourhood Watch areas!** Members receive branded stickers and crime prevention advice, and each registered scheme has hi-viz street-signs to boost visibility.
- Signing-up via **ourwatch.org.uk** gets you official **Police Alert email messages**. It's not social media. You can reply if you saw or heard anything regarding local incidents, crimes, appeals, etc.
- On the same website, tick if you have domestic CCTV (i.e. doorbell camera). This allows the Police powerful intelligence-gathering: they can contact you for any video information relevant to local issues.
- Under the tab **Find your local NW**, do the postcode search and join a local scheme. More members mean a greater partnership with the Police and a stronger, more aware community with confidence to report issues. If no scheme near you, scroll down, map your road and submit. An expert volunteer gets in touch.
- For added-value, members have the benefit of reduced-price security products, and many insurance companies offer lower premiums to members.

Membership is free of charge. There is no commitment to attend meetings or go on patrol or extra volunteering. A strong and visible Neighbourhood Watch deters crime and reinforces a community that cares and looks out for each other.
